PROBLEMS AND EXPECTATIONS STATEDBY NURSING ACADEMICIANS AND STUDENTS TO NURSING EDUCATIONASSOCIATION

Nursing Education Association was established in 2007 aiming to develop and maintain the quality of undergraduate and graduate nursing education in Turkey. It continues its activities to reach thesetargets. Requests, suggestions and problems are communicated to association on many differentaspects. In this presentation, requests, suggestions and problems submitted to association contactaddress and social media account between 2014-2017 will be presented in categories. The mostfrequently asked issue among these topics are; the fact that public hospitals do not accept nursingstudents in their areas of practice, the inability of students to perform clinical practice, and studentscharge fees from institutions. Moreover, the availability of quotas for nursing programs and the needfor intervention in this regard have been the most important agenda items of our association. Otherissues shared with the association are; problems related to nursing completion program, opinionsabout the decisions taken by the Council of Higher Education, preceptor nurse course requests, information and opinion requests for the problems experienced by our members and students andshare the congress, course and event announcements with the members of the association. It hasbeen determined that students and candidates communicate through social media accounts more. Shared topics in social media account; university and departmental preferences, request forinformation about the nursing profession, graduate programs horizontal and vertical transition,undergraduate completion programme, and the preparation of homework for undergraduatestudents. When the sharing of the mentioned subjects is examined, it appears that there isinteraction with many educators and nurse candidates who are members and non-membersregarding the activities of the Nursing Education Association and the agenda items it watches. It willstrengthen the ability of the association to reach a large educational mass and solve the problems that our active members
